Early Years Educator Apprenticeship

An early year's educator is a highly trained professional who play a key role in ensuring that young children learn and develop and are kept healthy and safe.

The early years educators job role you will work to the early years foundation stage (EYFS) requirements, as set by the government for the learning, development and care of children from birth to 5 years old.

As an early year educator, you will work effectively

with colleagues, outside professionals and parents/carers to meet the individual needs of children.

The apprentice will be expected to be able to be able to show initiative, be a strong communicator with a proactive approach, work as part of a team and independently and be a problem solver.

Access Training will work with you to design a training package that covers all the essential skills, behaviours and knowledge to provide a quality early years educator.

Apprentices will gain a good understanding of the key responsibilities and skills needed to work successfully in this role including:

- *Maths and English Functional skills to level 2**

More about Apprenticeships

An Apprenticeship is a real job with an accompanying skills development programme. It is a way to earn while they learn and gain valuable skills and knowledge in a specific job role.

They must spend at least 20% of their time on off-the-job training which will consist of a wide mix of learning in the workplace, workshops, e-learning, mentoring, self-study and the opportunity to practise new skills at work. Apprenticeships typically last between 12 – 24 months and our roll-on, roll-off model means there is no waiting for course start dates.
